Opening the Sealed Scroll Part 2

Revelation 6:9-17

I. <u>Introduction:</u>

A. Context

- **1.** Context is set in heaven. John was exiled on Isle of Patmos for preaching the Gospel.
- **2.** John was called up to heaven to receive the revelation which he recorded.
- **3.** He's describing events that will take place in the 7-year period called the tribulation.
- **4.** The judgment of the tribulation is revealed in three groups.
 - a. Seal judgments
 - **b.** Trumpet judgments
 - c. Bowl judgments

B. First four seals

The first four seals opened by Jesus revealed four horses and riders.

1. – White horse

- **a.** The first seal brought forth a white horse with a rider who had a bow and a crown.
- **b.** This horse and rider represent the false peace of the first half of the tribulation.
- **c.** The antichrist will bring a false peace that will last three and a half years.
- d. At ½ way through tribulation he'll break his covenant w/ Israel& declare himself god

2. – Red horse

a. The red horse represents war. When antichrist reveals his true nature, world war breaks out. There'll be war in the last ½ of the tribulation like world's never seen.

3. – Black horse

- **a.** The black horse represents the famine that will accompany war.
- **b.** Famine will grip the world as every nation fights against one another.

4. – Pale horse

- **a.** The pale horse represents pestilence and disease. As the world descends into chaos in the last ½ of the tribulation, disease will spread unchecked.
- **b.** Application: You do not want to be here when the tribulation begins.

II. The 5th seal (Revelation 6:9-11)

This brings us to the opening of the 5th seal.

A. Martyred tribulation saints

John saw the souls of those who were martyred for their faith.

1. – Souls under the alter

- **a.** This description fits with the practice of offerings in the temple on earth.
- **b.** Sacrificial animals were slain on the brazen alter standing at tabernacle's entrance.
- **c.** The blood would run down under the alter representing the life of the animal.
- **d.** In like manner these saints were slain because of their faith& commitment to Jesus.
- e. They gave their literal lives as an offering to God rather than deny His name.

2. – These are tribulation saints.

a. The church age saints were raptured before the tribulation began; therefore, these are the saints who will be murdered during the tribulation.

- **b.** Many will be saved by faith in Jesus during the tribulation, but most of those who trust Jesus in the tribulation will be hunted, persecuted, & executed for their faith.
- **c.** Those who won't accept Jesus in this day of grace when it's so easy won't accept Jesus in a day when it will cost them everything.

B. Their question

- **1.** Martyred tribulation saints ask God, "How long until you bring judgement on those who killed us? How long until there's justice for wicked atrocities perpetrating earth?"
- **2.** The question is not selfish or malicious, nor driven by personal revenge.
- 3. Question is from hearts that understand the justice and righteousness of our Holy God.
- **4**. Application: We might ask the same question, "How long Lord do you tarry?"

C. God's answer (Revelation 6:11)

- 1. Gave each of them a white robe
 - a. The white robe represents victory in Jesus.
 - **b.** It represents their purity & holiness before God & eternal place as citizens in heaven
 - **c.** Those who are saved have an eternal relationship with God the Father.
- 2. Wait a little longer.
 - **a**. God invited the martyred saints to wait patiently as more would be added to them.
 - **b**. As the tribulation continued to unfold, more would be saved & martyred.
 - c. These saints were encouraged to wait patiently as God's plan ran its full course.
 - **d.** <u>Application:</u> We long for Jesus to return for His bride, the church, but we do not know the exact time of God's plan. We're to live for Him & be patient

III. The 6th seal, a broken universe (Revelation 6:12-14)

A. The end of the tribulation

In final stages of 7-year tribulation all creation will be shaken & moved out of its natural order.

- **1.** Great earthquakes will shake the whole earth.
 - a. The earthquakes will be so powerful that mountains& islands will move out of place
 - **b.** Mountains will be leveled, and islands will disappear.
- 2. Cosmic upheaval
 - a. Celestial bodies, fixed by the command of God since creation, will be moved.
 - **b.** The sun and the moon will fail to shine. The stars will be moved out of their places.
 - c. Jesus warned of the very thing John describes in this passage. (Matthew 24:29)

IV. Terror of God's wrath (Revelation 6:15-17)

A. The wrath of the Lamb

- 1. This is the part of God's nature no one wants to talk about today.
- 2. We know God is love and He desires all men to be saved.
- 3. There's day coming when God will pour out His wrath against wicked men & women.
- **4.** God will bring judgment& justice to His universe thus answering the martyrs' question
- **5.** At the end of the tribulation, God's wrath will be poured out without mitigation.

B. Response is fear.

- 1. The response of every lost person is fear. There is no negotiation with God!
- 2. The people at the end of the tribulation try to hide from God.
- **3.** They would rather have the mountains fall on them than face God.
- **4.** No one will be able to stand before God in the day of His wrath. (**Revelation 6:17**)
