Evidence of Knowing God

1 John 2:3-11

I. <u>Introduction:</u>

A. Knowing God

- There are three key components involved in knowing God.
 - 1. Revelation
 - **a.** Knowing God begins with revelation. Man lacks capacity to know God unless He reveals Himself to us. Man cannot discover and figure out God on his own.
 - **b.** God has revealed Himself to man in the following ways:
 - (1) General Revelation: Creation, Beauty, Life, & Love
 - (2) <u>Special Revelation:</u> Prophecy, Miracles, Resurrection of Jesus
 - The Bible, & The Holy Spirit
 - c. The Gospel of Jesus Christ is a special revelation & is God's power unto salvation.
 - **d.** One knows God through faith in Jesus because God loved 1st & revealed Himself
 - 2. Intellect
 - a. After we're saved, we grow in our knowledge of God through the study of His word.
 - b. We aren't saved by intellect or knowledge. We learn more about God after salvation
 - **c.** The saving knowledge of God is then enhanced with life-long learning.

3. – Emotions

- a. The more we learn about God, closer we're drawn to Him, & more we'll love Him.
- **b.** The more we love& surrender to God, more our emotions will be stirred by the truth
- c. Emotional worship is natural as those saved have an increasing knowledge of God.
- **d.** Warning: A saving knowledge of God doesn't begin with intellect or with emotion.
- **e.** Intellectual knowledge & emotions follow divine revelation whereby we believe by grace through faith unto salvation.

II. Evidence of knowing God (1 John 2:3-6)

A. Keep His commandments.

- **1.** 1st evidence of a genuine saving relationship with God is keeping His commandments.
- 2. Positive proof person knows God is seen in a genuine desire to obey Him. (I John 2:3)
- **3.** Outward evidence of being saved is obedience to God. To know God is to obey God.
- **4**. Important: We do not obey God to be saved, we obey God because we are saved.
- **5**. We obey God because we love Him and desire to do His commands.
- **6.** This obedience comes from inner transformation, not outward pressure & conformity.

B. Evidence of hypocrisy

- 1. If person claims to know God &doesn't keep His commands there's problem, John said (1 John 2:4.) 1 claiming salvation, yet lives in habitual disobedience to God's a liar.
- 2. John said the truth is not in the person who would make such a claim.
- 3. Person claiming salvation & lives in rebellion against God's law is blinded to the truth.
- **4**. That person has no concept of knowing God and having a relationship with Him.
- 5. Dishonest & blind is the person who claims to know God &does not seek to obey Him.

C. Obedience is connected to love.

- 1. Another aspect of knowing God is to love God. (1 John 1:5)
- **2.** Not only does obedience show genuinely knowledge of God, it's outward showing that we love God. To have the love of God "perfected in us" is to have it complete.
- **3.** The word is *teleioo* which can also means mature.
- **4.** Our desire to obey Jesus is evidence of the love of God being matured in our lives.
- 5. Application: One can't say they love Jesus & then live in open & unrepentant sin.

D. Abiding and walking

- 1. 2nd evidence of genuine knowledge of God is walking in this life like Jesus. (1 Jn 1:6)
- 2. To abide in Christ means a permanent, habitual condition.
- **3.** An overwhelming evidence of knowing Jesus, of being genuinely saved, is a life that is constantly being conformed to the image of Jesus.

E. Summary of this section:

1. - Intellect

- **a.** Intellectual understanding, knowing God, is part of salvation but alone doesn't save.
- **b.** In fact, we are to study to show ourselves approved, a workman who is not ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth (2 Timothy 2:15).
- **c.** We know God by grace through faith in Jesus alone.

2. – Emotion

- **a.** Emotion& passion are parts of being saved& knowing God, but emotional experience alone won't save a person. Knowing God, we're saved through faith in Jesus alone.
- **b.** More one knows God, the more emotional they become about God's blessings.

3. – To know God is to obey God.

- a. This doesn't mean we're perfect in this life. It means our habit is obedience to Jesus.
- b. Disobedience is exception. We confess sin immediately& pursue obedience, renewed

4. – To know God is to abide in Him.

a. To be saved is to abide in Christ all the time. It's a perpetual state of transition into Christ image. To be saved is to be in process of sanctification all the time.

F. Measure your life.

- 1. This is where we take inventory of our lives and see where we stand.
- 2. Do we know Jesus, have we been saved by faith in Him?
- **3.** Does our life demonstrate a genuine knowledge of Jesus through obedience?

III. Old and New Command (1 John 2:7-11)

A. Love & Hate

- **1.** The third evidence that we truly know God is love.
- 2. To love others is both an old commandment and a new commandment.
- 3. Old: The command to love is found in the books of the Mosaic law. (Leviticus 19:18)
- **4.** The moral of God's law from beginning was for us to love our neighbor as ourselves.
- **5.** New: We are now to love others as Jesus has loved us.
- 6. Hanging on the cross Jesus loved & prayed for men who were killing Him (Lk 23:34)
- 7. We are called to love others in the same way. (Matthew 5:43-44)
- **8.** Evidence: The evidence we know God is seen in how we love others.

B. Light and Darkness

- **1.** Jesus is the light of the world. Those who love like Jesus are walking in the light.
- **2.** Those who hate and harbor unforgiveness in their hearts demonstrate they do not know God. Those who hate are walking in darkness.
