Nebuchadnezzar's Pride

Daniel 4:1-37

I. <u>Introduction:</u>

A. Context

- 1. The context of Daniel, chapter 4 is set in Babylon in the 6th century B.C.
- 2. Nebuchadnezzar conquered Israel & made them a vassal state of Babylonian Empire.
- **3.** God allowed Israel to be conquered as judgement for the nation's sin and rebellion.
- **4**. Many Hebrews were taken captive to Babylon of which Daniel was part of 1st group.
- **5.** He was chosen to serve in the king's administration as a wise man.
- **6.** Daniel's Gift: God blessed Daniel with the ability to interpret dreams.
- **7.** Daniel interpreted a dream earlier for Nebuchadnezzar & was promoted to prime minister of all Babylon. Nebuchadnezzar's king & Daniel is prime minister of the nation.

B. Nebuchadnezzar's Pride

- **1.** God hates all sin & will judge all sin, often in this life, & certainly on judgment day when this life is over. But there's one sin that God often judges sooner rather than later.
- 2. That is the sin of pride. Solomon said it's an abomination before God. (Pro. 6:16-19)
- 3. This was Nebuchadnezzar's sin and God would judge him for it.

C. Background

- 1. In chapter 2 God gave Nebuchadnezzar the dream of the statue.
- 2. The head of Gold represented him. But God said his kingdom would be replaced by the silver kingdom. Nebuchadnezzar built an image on the plain of Dura in all gold.
- **3.** Nebuchadnezzar was defiant to God's revelation & was in essence saying to God that his kingdom would last forever.

II. Another Dream (Daniel 4:4-18)

A. A Tree

- **1.** The king saw a great tree in his dream. The tree flourished & all the animals were blessed & found refuge in and under the tree.
- 2. But a watchman commanded for the tree to be cut down and the animals scattered.
- 3. The root was to be preserved for 7 periods or years. Tree was cut down, but didn't die.
- **4.** <u>Interpretation:</u> None of Babylon's wise men could interpret dream, so Nebuchadnezzar called once more on Daniel who recognized and knew the interpretation immediately.
- 5. The tree represented the king & his kingdom. His kingdom filled the whole world.
- **6.** All the peoples, nations, and tribes flourished because of his kingdom.
- 7. But because of Nebuchadnezzar's pride God would have the tree chopped down.
- **8**. God would strike him with mental illness& remove him from the throne for 7 years.
- **9**. But God would preserve his throne & kingdom, restoring him after the seven years.

III. <u>Daniel's Recommendation</u> (Daniel 4:27)

A. Repentance

- 1. In the face of impending judgment, God declared it, Daniel called for repentance.
- **2.** Repentance is an essential doctrine that is true from the Old Testament to the New.

- **3.** Repentance means turning from one direction and going in the opposite direction.
- **4.** It means to turn from pursuing sin and begin pursuing obedience and holiness.
- **5.** Repentance does not mean we become sinlessly perfect in our lifestyle.
- **6.** What it does mean is this; When we confess our sin to God & ask for His forgiveness, a willingness & desire to forsake our sin and pursue righteousness occurs.

7. Examples

(1)- A Drunkard

- **a.** One who's addicted to alcoholic beverages & wants salvation will confess their sin to God &ask for His forgiveness. God will save anyone who will ask.
- **b**. There should be true desire for God's delivering power from alcohol's bondage.
- **c.** That desire to change, that turning from sin to righteousness is called repentance.
- **d.** God may deliver the person from their addition supernaturally or use medicine and /or a support group to deliver the person.

(2) – Sexual Addictions

- **a**. The same would be true for a person who has a sexual addiction of some kind.
- **b.** At time of confessing sin& being saved by faith in Jesus, there must be willingness to turn from & forsake sin. A repentant heart must accompany the confession.
- c. For example, an adulterer does not want to be an adulterer anymore.
- **d.** God can and will deliver us from any sin that we are willing to confess & forsake.

(3) – The Moral Person

- **a.** The same is true for the apparent moral person. Person who seems to have no real major sin problem must still come to God with a repentant heart. (**Romans 3:23**)
- **b.** We are all sinners, no matter how good or bad we look on the outside.
- c. We all need to confess our sin with a repentant heart & place our faith in Jesus.

IV. Nebuchadnezzar's Failure (Daniel 4:28-33)

A. One Full Year

- 1. From the time of the dream to the time of judgment's execution was one full year.
- **2.** God waited a full year before executing the judgment because of His Grace.
- 3. Judgement never falls without warning which is then followed by time of opportunity.
- **4.** God's not slack concerning coming judgment. He's not winking at sin & letting us go.
- **5.** God desires for us to be saved. **(2 Peter 3:9)** God wants to forgive our sin & grant us eternal life with Him. But we must humble ourselves, confess, and repent of our sin.
- **6.** Application: Don't be like Nebuchadnezzar wasting opportunity to receive God's grace

V. <u>Nebuchadnezzar a Save Man (Daniel 4:34-37)</u>

A. The Most High God

- 1. Jehovah God is referred to throughout this chapter as the Most High God.
- 2. 1st time this phrase was used of God was in Genesis when Abraham met Melchizedek.
- 3. Melchizedek was the priest of the Most High God, ruler of heaven and earth.
- **4.**This name for God refers to His sovereignty. God rules in heaven & He rules on earth.
- **5.** This is why pride is so offensive to God. He is sovereign and we are not!
- 6. Nebuchadnezzar declared his faith in the true Most High God.

B. Nebuchadnezzar Was Saved

- 1. Nebuchadnezzar became a saved man by faith, just like today.
- 2. This pagan king who got saved is in heaven right now.
